





2021 EXIT ART WINNERS ANNOUNCED

Edward Puruntatameri from St John's Catholic College in Darwin was the recipient of the 2021 Minister's Choice Award with Round Tiwi Art-Croc.

"I feel really happy, the hard work was worth it. There was a lot of sketching and experimenting that went into the painting and lots of work to create that design. My art work is inspired by my uncle Robert Puruntatameri. The crocodile symbolises a common animal that surrounds Tiwi islands in hunting. Most of my family has [the] crocodile as their totem but not me. My totem is [the] sea turtle," Edward Puruntatameri said.

51 talented finalists from across the Northern Territory were selected in the annual *Exit Art* student exhibition, which is celebrating its 30 year legacy.

Exit Art offers a platform to showcase the exemplary contemporary art and design from Northern Territory Year 12 students and is jointly presented by the Museum and Art Gallery of the Northern Territory and the NT Department of Education.

Emma King, Art Educators of the NT Award Winner said, "I remember coming to the Museum when I was little. Seeing my artwork up on the wall now is really personal to me."

The 2021 shortlist includes an inspiring variety of mediums including photography, film, textiles, painting and mixed media.
