

2022 EXIT ART FINALISTS ANNOUNCED

53 talented finalists from across the Northern Territory have been selected in the annual *Exit Art* student exhibition held at the Museum and Art Gallery of the Northern Territory.

104 entries were received from high schools in Darwin, Palmerston, Nhulunbuy and Alice Springs, featuring a broad variety of mediums including painting, photography, mixed media, ceramics, wood and recycled plastic.

Exit Art offers a platform to showcase excellent contemporary art and design from Northern Territory Year 12 students.

Our visitors are always curious to see the breadth of the technical skill and themes which arise in *Exit Art* each year.
